

Concord Community Concert Association – 89th season

Concord Community Concert Association opens its 89th season of affordable, world-class music with the shimmering, colorful sounds of the **Borealis Wind Quintet** on Saturday, September 28 at 7:30 pm at Concord City Auditorium. “A polished, elegantly turned performance ... lively, communicative readings ... the performance was a scintillating one,” according to the New York Times. Nominated for a Grammy in 2006, the quintet is clearly one of the best in the world. The theme for 2019-20 is “An American Landscape,” with pieces ranging from Copland to Bernstein. The evening starts at 7:00 pm with a dessert party and popular Fall silent auction.

The five concerts are an eclectic mix of musical styles tailored to a Concord audience:

- **Borealis** (above)
- **Brubeck Brothers Quartet on November 9**
- **“A Grand Time for Singing” on February 23**, with the sounds of the NH Gay Men’s Chorus, Suncook Valley Chorale and the NH Master Chorale. The groups will perform individually and together for a mid-winter celebration of New Hampshire choruses.
- **Richard Dowling performing “Piano Masterpieces” on March 21**. Dowling has a range from Chopin to Scott Joplin and beyond.
- **Duo Baldo from Italy on April 25**, blending physical comedy and classical music in a very entertaining way!

All shows begin at 7:30 pm, except for the “Grand Time for Singing,” which begins at 3:00 pm.

CCCA \$60 season tickets (\$75 after September 15) include 11 concerts, with accompanying children free in Concord.
